 7. Whether there were previous referrals against the respondent.
- c) The reports must not include identifying information for the respondent or the party who submitted the referral.

Our LPP has received two complaints. The conduct complained of involves lack of decorum, bad faith actions, bullying and unfair, dilatory tactics.

3. What are believed to be the causes of professionalism issues within your Circuit?

At this time, I am unable to identify the causes of professionalism issues within our Circuit, but will obtain additional information needed to do so. I will, however, highlight the efforts of our local bar association to encourage civility and professionalism amongst lawyers in our Circuit. The Professionalism Committee of the Palm Beach County Bar Association, which is made up of paralegals, lawyers, and judges, actively promotes the Oath of Civility; addresses ways to instill a sense of professionalism in Bar members; and conducts CLE programs on ethics and professionalism throughout the year. The Professionalism Committee encourages attorneys of all levels and practice areas to frequently review the Florida Bar Professionalism Expectations and provides a list of helpful links and resources for attorneys in Palm Beach County practicing in both state and federal court.
